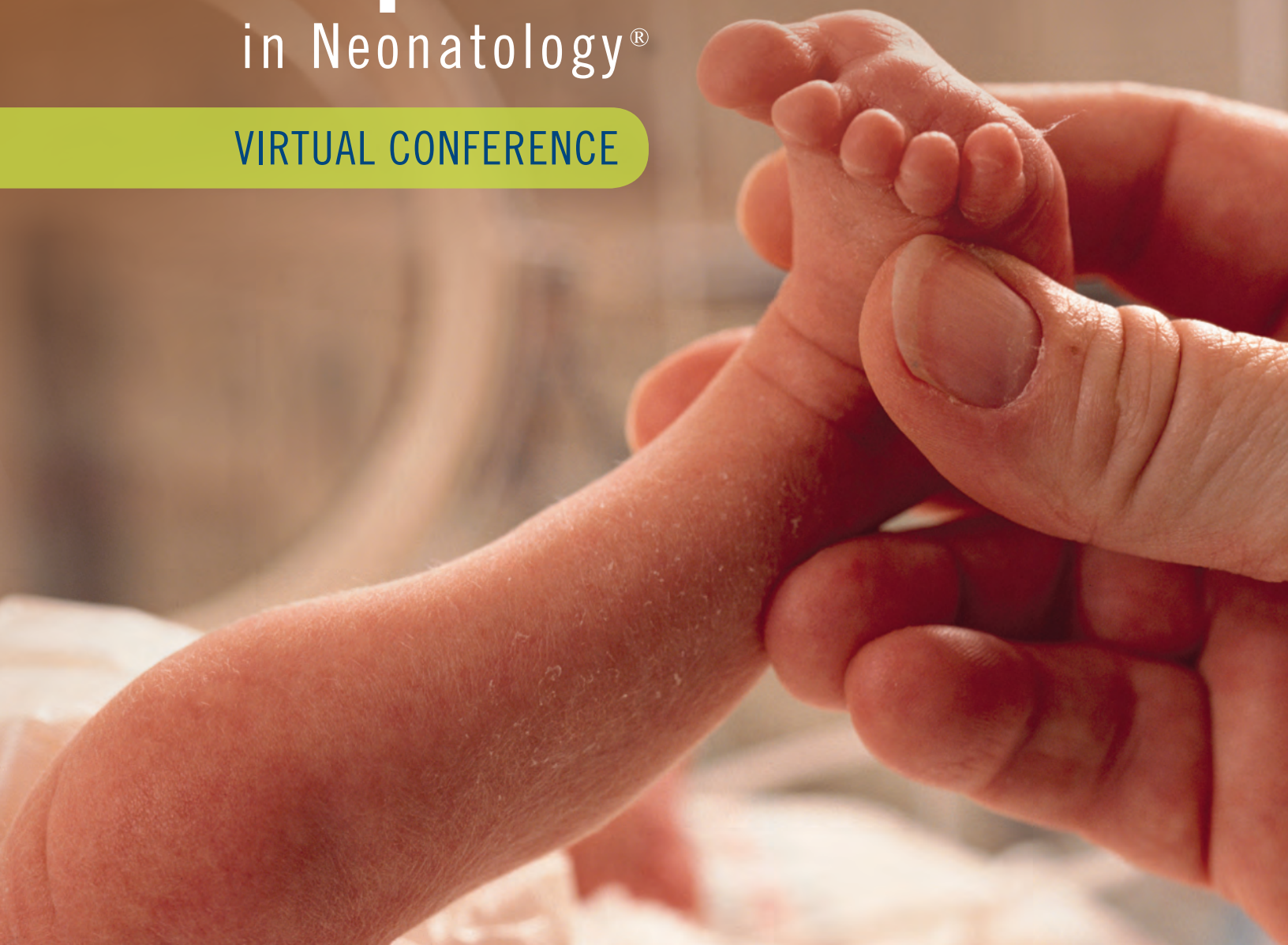

Learning Objectives
